


This aerial sketch gives a sense of the effect of the removal of the 1950's and 1960's additions. The public entry now faces Monclare with drop off and a modest mount of parking.

#### HISTORICAL PLANNING CONTEXT

40+ member planning committee formed in 2011

Committee recommended plan in Spring 2012

Plan included work at all sites but also modest Phase 1 investment at KUHS including:

- Demolition of 1950's additions (reduces system upgrade costs & has less than half the students it once held
- Critical systems upgrades
- · Relocation of offices to Monclare side
- Development of 30+/- parking and drop off an entry toward Monclare
- · Hard link to Cafeteria / Arts Building
- Expansion of MP Space to full gym

#### Fall 2013 – Re-visiting KUHS Plan to be more comprehensive for:

- All building systems
- All building finishes (interior and exterior)
- Instructional areas
- Locker room renovations
- Performance space(s)





This view is the proposed new Public Entry facing Monclare with the 50's and 60's additions removed. The facade would be classical to match the opposite face. At the far right, the reworked link is shown leading to the Cafeteria / Music Building





This view of the current main facade shows that what the community cares most about is preserved. The students would still use this as a primary entry point given the location of their parking area.





This view shows the existing main façade is unaltered – save for the replacement windows and the re-pointing of the masonry. What IS altered is the Cafeteria / Music Building shown at the left, with the expansion to house the second gymnasium and the re-work of the link between the two buildings.






### FLOOR BY FLOOR TRANSFORMATION BIG IDEA CONCEPTS

- INDEPENDENT (yet visible) STUDY AREAS




